RECYCLING GUIDE

RECYCLING ON CAMPUS MUST BE SORTED!

Sorting your recycling on campus may be different than what you are used to at home, but there are major benefits to separating recyclables such as:

1. We sell materials back to distributors and manufacturers to help fund this program.
2. Our sorting model cuts down on contamination that plagues single stream models.



CHECK EVERY RECYCLING BIN FOR SPECIFICS ON WHAT CAN BE RECYCLED IN THAT CONTAINER.

PAPER

Mixed Pack Paper is any heavily inked product such as:

- Newspapers
- Magazines
- Advertising Inserts
- Paperboard (i.e. frozen food boxes)

Office Pack paper is the paper products you imagine in most work environments, such as:

- Plain White Paper
- Pre-Shredded Office Paper
- Envelopes
- Manila Envelopes and Folders
- Bound Paper (Wire or Plastic)

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD

Corrugated cardboard is usually made of three different layers, the two outer layers having a smooth surface while the central inner layer is corrugated.

(Corrugated Cardboard)



When you are recycling corrugated cardboard, please remember:

- No food waste
- Must be broken down
- Must be corrugated
- No pizza boxes

Non-corrugated cardboard belongs in the Mixed Pack bins.

PLASTICS 1 (PETE) & 2 (HOPE)



We do not collect plastics 3 - 7 at this time, but would encourage staff, faculty and students to take them home to be recycled. To find out what type of plastic you have, look on the bottom in the recycling triangle. If there is no number it is most likely a 7.

ALUMINUM CANS & FOIL



Aluminum cans and foil are collected in the aluminum bins. Tin cans must be completely rinsed out and placed in a separate plastic bag.

PRINTER & TONER CARTRIDGES

Printer & toner cartridges must be placed in a box for pick up. It does not need to be the original box it came in. Please collect a few before contacting Waste Management at 801-581-5173.



BATTERIES



Batteries can be recycled on campus. Both ends need to be taped. Environmental Health and Safety (EH&S) is responsible for pick up.
